EXPERIENCE IN EMERGENCY CONTEXTS

ABAAD has responded to some of the most complex crises in the region, including the Syrian refugee crisis, the COVID-19 pandemic, and the Beirut Port explosion. Each has strengthened our capacity to mobilize quickly, adapt to shifting conditions, and deliver quality services under pressure.

TECHNICAL SUPPORT AVAILABLE

ABAAD will make available a range of technical support services to sectoral partners operating in the emergency response:

- 1 Rapid protection assessments**
in collective shelters to identify GBV risks and protection gaps
- 2 Technical assistance**
to improve shelter conditions and ensure safe, dignified environments for women, children, and at-risk groups
- 3 Technical accompaniment**
Technical accompaniment for service providers and frontline responders on GBV case management, PSEAH, and Accountability to Affected Populations (AAP)
- 4 Self-care tools and staff wellbeing support**
for frontline responders, including ABAAD's own field teams, to sustain service delivery under high-pressure conditions
